

# Hajar (AS)

The tradition of pacing back and forth between the hills of Safa and Marwa is traced back to Ismail's (AS) mother Hajar (AS), who ran between them in search of water for her baby. In honour of her courage and faith, this incident is commemorated by Muslims through the act of Sa'i (pacing between Safa and Marwa) during Hajj and Umrah.




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
# Cows, oxen, buffalo, sheep, camels and goats

Animals acceptable for Qurbani are 'beasts of cattle.' This includes cows, oxen, buffalo, sheep, camels or goats. All animals sacrificed for Qurbani must have reached adulthood. For sheep, this is between six months to (preferably) one year. For goats, this is one year. For cows etc., this is at two years of age. For camels, this is at five years.
