Each year, our Founder and Chairman, Imran Khan, conveys his message here, but due to his unavailability, I am writing to update you about our projects. The Chairman, nevertheless, has conveyed his gratitude for your unstinting support towards fighting cancer in Pakistan.

On 29th December 2023, we completed twenty-nine years of service, remaining steadfast on our founders vision to provide quality cancer treatment, irrespective of a patient's wealth - with over 75 percent of our patients receiving free treatment.


In Lahore, to increase capacity, we have installed a new multi-million pound linear accelerator and opened a new 12-bed admission holding bay to improve patient flow. In Peshawar, we plan to: expand our surgical oncology services for breast cancer; open two new operating rooms and expand our diagnostic capabilities in pulmonology. In Karachi, we have utilised £31 million to complete the grey structure, and require around £54 million for completion to bring hope against cancer closer to the people of Sindh and Balochistan. In 2024, we need £100 million to manage two Hospitals and complete Karachi.

Even in these challenging economic times, we know you have always supported those who are less fortunate. As such, we request your generous donations and Zakat to help continue giving hope to people with cancer.

MEDICAL ONCOLOG

Patients Receive Multidisciplinary Cancer Care Under One Roof

We provide comprehensive and compassionate care to all our cancer patients at Shaukat Khanum Hospitals in Lahore and Peshawar, in accordance with established international guidelines and to the highest standards of care. All cancer patients are discussed in a multidisciplinary conference where a team works together to prepare a personalised treatment plan for each individual patient.

At our Hospitals:

- We follow disease-specific internationally-accepted management guidelines
- We treat a broad range of cancer types in both children and adults
- Our outpatient Chemotherapy Bay is functional around the clock

I have been working at Shaukat Khanum since 2006.

I come from a village where girls don't often go to college but it was my father's dream that I become a nurse and a strong independent woman.

In 1989, I made his dream a reality and completed my diploma in nursing – a year later I began work in the Middle East.

After 15 years, I returned to Pakistan and joined Shaukat Khanum because of its high standard of care, where I could use my training and grow professionally as well. Patient care is a soul-touching experience. I remember a breast cancer patient who was hesitant to undergo treatment with the loss of hair, a mastectomy and society's reaction to her altered physical appearance. I encouraged her with the support that was available in the form of breast prosthesis as well as a wig – she changed her mind, completed the treatment and survived.

Experiences like these are priceless and keep me striving harder for Shaukat Khanum and its patients.


SURGICAL ONCOLOGY

Surgery is an important part of treatment for many types of cancer. The Department of Surgical Oncology offers comprehensive evaluation, diagnosis, and management of both adult and paediatric cancer patients. Our surgeons work in close collaboration with medical and radiation oncologists to ensure that a multidisciplinary approach is followed for each patient at the Hospitals in Lahore and Peshawar.

Our Surgeons:

- Use advanced minimally invasive surgical techniques
- Treat patients with tumours of the upper and lower gastrointestinal tract, the hepato-pancreato-biliary system, with breast cancer and with diverse other malignancies, including those of the brain and spine (neurosurgery), orthopaedics, the head and neck region, the chest and lungs, as well as of the female genital tract and of the urologic system



Over the past few years, advances in radiation therapy have improved treatment outcomes for patients. At Shaukat Khanum Hospitals in Lahore and Peshawar, we regularly upgrade our equipment to remain at the cutting edge of technology and radiotherapy services in the region.

We offer:

- Stereotactic Radiosurgery (SRS) for lesions in the brain and other parts of the body, using the most advanced linear accelerator (LINAC)-based system
- Sophisticated planning system
- Technology that uses precisely focused radiation with a high degree of accuracy

I have been working at Shaukat Khanum since 2022.

I was a consultant radiation oncologist in the UK when I moved back to Pakistan and joined Shaukat Khanum.

Lahore houses one of the largest radiation departments in the country with the same radiation technology that was available in the UK also available here. When patients come to my clinic, I do not know if they are paying for their treatment or if they are receiving financially supported treatment – as such, all of them receive the same time, attention, and quality of care. My journey so far has been extremely rewarding. The prayers of patients and their satisfaction keeps me going during a hectic day.

Working here gives me a unique feeling that I am giving back to my community by serving the most needy patients in a way that doesn't happen when working overseas. I consider it a privilege to work at Shaukat Khanum and know that the more our supporters donate, the more patients we can treat.

PALLIATIVE ONCOLOG

Improving Quality of Life for Cancer Patients

We run specialist palliative medicine clinics at Lahore and Peshawar for patients who require symptom management for terminal as well as chronic conditions. Our palliative service aims to improve the quality of life for all cancer patients regardless of age, stage of disease or prognosis.

We have:

- > Multidisciplinary clinics with highly trained physicians
- Specialist palliative care nurses
- Supported by anaesthesia team for pain-control interventions

- > End-of-life care for terminally ill patients
- A Home Palliative Care Service now available for patients in Lahore and Peshawar to improve their quality of life with home visits by a team of specialist doctors and nurses

DR HAROON HAFIZ

Consultant Physician Palliative Medicine – Director Quality & Patient Safety Department



I have been working at Shaukat Khanum since 2006.

700 students having graduated since. The idea came when my nephew was undergoing treatment for blood cancer and was worried about missing school - with help from his school, he managed to stay at par with his classmates.

This made me think of our other children. For those in education, we worked with their schools to cover their schoolwork. This also gave them hope for a normal life one day. For children who did not go to school, we developed a workbook helping them learn English, Urdu, and Maths at Class 1. Along with education, we also offer children play therapy and distraction activities that focus on constructive work, diverting their attention away from their illness and helping a positive response to treatment.

I love the work I do at Shaukat Khanum and am always thinking about how to improve the lives of patients – and when we do, there is no better feeling.

KARACHI

In Karachi, the physical 'grey structure' for Pakistan's largest tertiary care cancer centre has been completed and we need to raise a further £54 million to make this project live.

The hospital will be equipped with the latest in technology for both diagnosis and treatment. This new hospital will not only benefit the people of Karachi, but also all of Sindh and Southern Balochistan. The total expected cost will be £85 million.

HOSPITAL

KARACHI MAJOR UPDATES

- Walk-in Clinic for cancer screening and triaging operationalised in May 2023
- Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning (HVAC) ducting and insulation works in progress
- Internal masonry and plaster works completed partially
- Flooring works at the Ground and the First floors of the main building, and administration building near completion
- Mechanical, Electrical, and Plumbing (MEP) piping works, cable laying within the buildings in progress
- External infrastructure development also in progress
- Water-proofing for the main building, waste drainage system, and roof water proofing to begin soon

KARACHI CURRENT CHALLENGES

- High inflation due to rupee depreciation against US\$
- Construction material supply-chain issue due to import challenges

PESHAWAR

In June 2023, the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Health Care Commission (KP HCC) conducted its 3-yearly assessment of the Hospital. They inspected the entire facility, reviewed documentation and met with the hospital management and staff. Once again, Peshawar successfully met the quality standard of healthcare delivery across the province.

In October 2023, the first home palliative care visit was made in Peshawar for a bed-ridden patient terminally ill with cancer.

In 2024, we plan to expand our surgical oncology services for breast cancer and we hope to open two new operating rooms. With the help of an endobronchial ultrasound (EBUS) system, we also plan to expand our diagnostic capabilities in pulmonology

LAHORE

In August 2023, to increase capacity. a multi-million pound Halcyon linear accelerator with advanced radiotherapy capability was installed. The Halcyon is six times faster which means more patients can be treated in the same amount of time. In addition, a new 12-bed admission holding bay was opened to improve patient flow. A new service was also launched to treat prostate cancers with PSMA (Prostate Specific Membrane Antigen), where an isotope is injected into the bloodstream to deliver radiation directly to cancer cells.

THE QUALITY ONCOLOGY PRACTICE INITIATIVE CERTIFICATION

In September 2023, Lahore received the OOPI® Certification from the American Society of Clinical Oncology (ASCO). This makes Pakistan the first country in South Asia and the sixth globally

to have obtained this, demonstrating the hospital's commitment to providing quality care for all patients, irrespective of their ability to pay.

IKCA PINK WALK - BIRMINGHAM

Birmingham hosted its first-ever 'IKCA Pink Walk' in Cannon Hill Park to raise funds and awareness for Breast Cancer.

Pakistan has one of the highest incidences of breast cancer in Asia - but it is treatable if detected in time and raising awareness and funds is vital in saving lives. Our supporters from Pak UK Fusion Society played a pivotal role in making this event possible, and women of all ages and abilities participated. The day began with a coffee morning workshop at the parks Midlands Art Centre, to learn about the signs of identifying breast cancer, as well as the importance of raising awareness of it in Pakistani communities.

The success of the first pink walk has now got people looking forward to making this an annual event in Birmingham.

Nadia signed up for our Three Peaks Challenge even though she was unsure due to health issues. However, she completed Scafell Pike and is looking forward to the next two as well!

"It was an amazing hike and a huge goal that I achieved. Last year, I was morbidly obese. I had a blue badge and was on 40+ tablets and morphine patches. I could barely walk a few steps without being in agony. Now, I have lost over 5 stones and no longer take any tablets."
